Kierkegaard's Concept of Despair
It's the choice between the possibility of the "temporal and the eternal", "mistrust and belief, and deception and truth", "subjective and objective". These are the "magnitudes" of choice. He always stressed deliberation and choice in his writings and wrote against comparison. This is how Kant put it in 1786 and Kierkegaard put it in 1847:

Such deception is intentional and requires the deceiver to know or believe that ~ p and the deceived to believe that p.
