The Right Balance -Technology and Patient Care

Findings indicate that when looking at experience level, there was a significant difference in normative belief between nurses with less than 15 years' experience and nurses with more than 15 years' experience (t 21 = 2.7, P = .01), possibly indicating that nurses with less experience were more favorable with the use of the technology because it was more of a normative behavior for them.
