Reinforcement theory suggests that behavior that is not rewarded will stop. Demotion is a punishment. Note that in most cases, punishment stops behavior for a short time, while extinction (or better yet, rewarding an incompatible behavior, such as praising Inga) is likely to have longer-lasting effects.
